# **Authentic Usedom - yesterday and today**

The island of Usedom is an attractive destination for guests from abroad. This is confirmed by a survey carried out by the German National Tourist Board (GNTB). 25,000 users from more than 20 countries were asked to name the tourist destinations they consider particularly recommendable. For the first time, Usedom, along with Rügen and Sylt, was one of three German islands to be voted into **Germany's Top 100**.

The island of Usedom is famous for its <a href="space-approximate">spa architecture</a>. In the imperial resorts of Ahlbeck - Heringsdorf - Bansin and the Baltic resort of Zinnowitz, piers and historic villas are reminders of the early days of bathing culture on the Baltic Sea. From the Wilhelminian period to the 1920s, wealthy owners built their magnificent summer residences on the Baltic Sea according to their taste, financial power and need for prestige. They made use of the rich treasure trove of stylistic elements from earlier epochs such as the Renaissance, Baroque, Classicism and Art Nouveau.

The <u>Kaiserbäder Adventure Trail</u>, which was inaugurated in spring 2023, uses an app to bring the spa architecture to life. On 27 elegant display stelae, the new tour provides an exciting insight into the history of the seaside resorts of Ahlbeck, Heringsdorf and Bansin and presents the Who's Who of the illustrious Kaiserbäder guests. With great attention to detail and the know-how of the local historical society, each stele has become a little jewel made of oak wood. The special highlight of the novel tour is digital interaction, which makes the sights and interesting personalities even more vivid by means of selfies, picture gallery, interactive videos, 3D model or 360° panorama. The <u>Kaiserbäder Adventure Trail app</u> can be downloaded on the mobile phone in German, English and Polish via a QR code and/or so-called geo-fencing.

Away from the promenades in the seaside resorts, the island shows its original side. Usedom's scenic diversity offers endless opportunities to explore the island on foot, by bike, kayak or sailboat. In particular, the close-to-nature, regional and authentic offers make it possible to experience the original Usedom. The trademark <a href="Usedom Pur">Usedom Pur</a> bundles these typical island experiences and gives the quality-conscious guest a reliable orientation guide in the abundance of offers. In addition to typical Usedom experiences and tours, the network also includes restaurants, natural manufactories and farm shops that offer seasonal and regional products and keep traditional recipes alive.

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# **MEERESMUSEUM Stralsund**

(Last updated: October 2023) The MEERESMUSEUM in Stralsund's historic city centre is housed in the former St. Catherine's Dominican Monastery built in 1251. This location is the oldest affiliate of the Ocean Museum Germany.

In the 1990s, the MEERESMUSEUM was complemented by two new museum locations: The NATUREUM at Darßer Ort in the Western Pomerania Lagoon Area National Park opened its doors with exhibits about the region's coastal landscape and fauna in 1991. The NAUTINEUM on the isle of Dänholm between Stralsund and Rügen established an exhibition space for fisheries, oceanographic research, hydrography and sea waterways in 1999. The latter location also serves as a depository and has a dissection facility for scientific examinations of marine animals.

In 2008, a fourth museum location, the modern OZEANEUM, opened its doors on Stralsund's harbour island. This location features four permanent exhibitions, including the largest Baltic Sea exhibit in Europe. The OZEANEUM focuses on various aspects of the northern seas, whereas the MEERESMUSEUM highlights the diversity of tropical oceans. In 2009, the Ocean Museum Germany with its four locations ranked third in the list of Germany's most visited museums, with a total of over 1.2 million visitors.

The main hall of the church St. Catherine, in which the MEERESMUSEUM is located, was subject to extensive renovations from 1972 to 1974, during which a unique metal frame was installed in the interior. The main hall was divided into three levels to provide space for the exhibits of the museum. Now MEERESMUSEUM will be modernized by mid-2024. Die Werft - Munich was contracted for exhibition design. The plans include a redesigned entrance foyer, new floor-to-ceiling display cases and original-sized installations of marine animals in the exhibitions, as well as an impressive large aquarium with a reef. The total usable floor space is 7500 m². The aquariums in the historic vaulted cellar of the monastery will be restructured to provide visitors again the opportunity to travel through the

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warm seas of our planet. Audiences favourites such as Marlene, the leatherback sea turtle, and the fin whale skeleton suspended from the arch of the former choir, will be presented again after the modernisation. The sea turtles will also continue to fascinate visitors while feeding and swimming in their 350,000 liter aquarium.

Reichel Schlaier Architekten in Stuttgart won the European-wide architectural competition for the modernisation of the MEERESMUSEUM in 2017. The winning design combines a careful approach to the museum's valuable historical structures with confident new architectural concepts - a balancing act between monument preservation in this world heritage site and the demands of a modern museum with a well-developed brand identity. The focus lies on sustainable building, including the energetic renovation of the aquariums. Furthermore, many improvements are planned to make visiting the MEERESMUSEUM even more enjoyable and to provide accessibility.

The cost of the measure before the start of construction was around 40 million euros. The Federal Ministry of the Interior and Community and the Ministry of Economics, Infrastructure, Tourism and Labor of the state of Mecklenburg-Vorpommern handed over the grant notifications for half of the construction costs each in June 2020. The Hanseatic City of Stralsund is participating by donating a plot of land worth just under 70,000 euros. In July 2023, the federal and state governments signaled further support of 11.1 million euros to offset the increased construction costs as a result of the Corona pandemic and the Ukraine war. The Federal Ministry for Housing, Urban Development and Building and the state government of Mecklenburg-Vorpommern are each providing half of the total sum required.

Digital elements of the new exhibitions in the MEERESMUSEUM, for example on oceanography and ocean currents on a digital globe and using prehistoric aquariums, are funded by the Federal Government Commissioner for Culture and the Media with 455,000 euro.



## **EXHIBITIONS**

# **Geological History of Pomerania**

Here you can experience the formation of the Pomeranian landscape from its geological profile, with layers of rock that are millions of years old, to specimens of fossilized amber and the effects of the Ice Age on the landscape.



# Pomerania from the Stone Age to the Reformation

The intriguing individual exhibits here paint a multifaceted picture of Pomerania since the first hunters and gatherers roamed the area. The Peterfitz Ring, a 2 kg gold ring from the tumultuous era of the Migration Period, is an exceptionally exciting find. An impressive highlight is the unique 30-square-metre Croy Tapestry, a testimony to the high culture at the court of the Griffins, the ruling Pomeranian dynasty.

# From Swedish times to the Prussian province of Pomerania

"Pomerania burnt to the ground!" – The Thirty Years' War was horrifically violent. After the war, Pomerania was divided for almost 200 years: One part was ruled by Sweden, another by Brandenburg. In 1815, Pomerania became a Prussian province. During this time, fishing villages became fashionable spas. The majestically decorated Vase of Eldena, which grateful students presented to the director of the State and Agricultural Academy in Eldena, will leave you with a profound impression.

# Pomerania in the 20th century – From the First World War to the present day

In view of the wars, the multiple collapses of state structures, and the huge population displacements and migration, the 20th century marked perhaps the greatest caesura in the history of the region. Ultimately, the name Pomerania almost completely disappeared in the era of the German Democratic Republic. It is only in the last 30 years that the structures that had arisen over centuries began to play a stronger role again. Since 2007, when the borders fell as Poland joined the Schengen area, Germans and Poles now meet as equals.

This exhibition shows the many facets of these ruptures and continuities. In addition to informative exhibits, media stations offer more in-depth information. Interviews with contemporary witnesses open up biographical approaches and narrate the history of the region from different perspectives.

### Visitors' Favourites of the painting collection

Where once the Grey Monks slept and dined, Caspar David Friedrich, Vincent van Gogh & Co. will still be there to welcome you, even during the construction work on the Galerie der Romantik. Caspar David Friedrich's paintings will sweep you off on an imaginative journey to the Ruins of Eldena in the Giant Mountains, or you can gaze with Karl Schmidt-Rottluff into a Pomeranian barn painted in glowing colours; alternatively, with the Norwegian Johan Christian Dahl, you can float down the moonlit Oder, drifting past the port city of Świnoujście (German: Swinemünde)... Surely your favourite painting is here – and looking forward to your visit!

# Gardens

The ensemble of the museum's buildings is complemented by gardens. The Monastery Garden and the Boulder Garden invite you to linger there.

# **EVENTS**

Public guided tours and art breaks are offered regularly. For an individual visit, the free audio guide is optionally available in German, English, and Polish. Groups can book guided tours in German or in foreign languages.

A broad range of the museum's educational programmes awaits school classes, kindergarten classes, and nursery school groups. Cross-border workshops, youth meetings, and conferences are organised by the Cultural Department for Pomerania and East Brandenburg.



Exhibition openings, lectures, discussion evenings, film screenings, concerts, family afternoons: a rich programme of events takes place in the glass-enclosed Museumsstraße. Highlights of the year include "A Day with Caspar David Friedrich" at the end of August and a regional Arts and Crafts Market on the first weekend of Advent.

# Caspar David Friedrich - Hometown Greifswald

The work of the Greifswald-born painter Caspar David Friedrich (1774–1840) has worldwide appeal. This internationally best-known and most famous son of Mecklenburg-Western Pomerania shaped the idea of German Romanticism like no other. In recent years, his œuvre has experienced an unprecedented surge in popularity.

After the first years of his apprenticeship in Greifswald and his studies in Copenhagen, Caspar David Friedrich settled in Dresden. But the painter never forgot his beloved homeland. It was here that he experienced his artistic breakthrough during his first trip to the island of Rügen on the Baltic sea; and he returned to what was then Swedish Pomerania time and again – especially in periods of crisis. His work is inseparably linked to the distinctive towers of the brick churches, the megalithic grave mounds, and, last but not least, the chalk cliffs on the island of Rügen.

In 2024, the University and Hanseatic City of Greifswald will celebrate a major and significant anniversary: the 250th birthday of Caspar David Friedrich.

# The Painting Collection of the Pomeranian State Museum

This top-notch collection of Caspar David Friedrich's works at the Pomeranian State Museum, which holds six original paintings and an extensive graphic collection, both demands and encourages a ceaseless preoccupation with the theme of Romanticism. In recent years, thanks to the support of renowned foundations, the collection has been steadily supplemented with new works by Caspar David Friedrich and his companions, including Johan Christian Dahl and Carl Gustav Carus.

Currently, the "Visitors' Favourites" of our first-class collection are exhibited in the Convent House. Until our new Galerie der Romantik is completed, Caspar David Friedrich's paintings – among them, "Ruins of Eldena in the Giant Mountains," which he gave to his eldest brother Adolf, "Neubrandenburg," the town from which his parents came, and the "Rock Gorge in the Harz Mountains" – are presented there. In 2006, one of Caspar David Friedrich's rare interiors was acquired; here, one can see his wife Caroline in the picture of the "Woman ascending to the light" as well as in its counterpart, the "Woman descending with candle".

In 2007, the museum purchased a bundle of documents from Caspar David Friedrich's descendants that had remained in his family's possession. This includes an early portrait drawing, previously thought to have been lost, showing Caspar David Friedrich's eldest sister, Catharina Dorothea Sponholz. In 2017, a Hamburg couple donated the extremely valuable pencil drawing "Meadows near Greifswald" (1806) to the museum. In the anniversary year 2024, this rich collection of masterful drawings, etchings, and watercolours – including the watercolour "Greifswald Market Place" (1818) – will be exhibited together for the first time.

In addition to the works of Caspar David Friedrich, you will also be able to marvel at the paintings of his friends and companions. For example, visitors will encounter Philipp Otto Runge, who was born in Wolgast and who, like Caspar David Friedrich, did not at first appear destined to be a painter. Visitors will also be able to admire the work of the medical doctor and painter Carl Gustav Carus. And they'll run into Caspar David Friedrich's neighbour on the banks of the Elbe – the Norwegian Johan Christian Dahl.

# The Caspar David Friedrich Centre

The Caspar David Friedrich Centre at Lange Straße 57, which opened in 2004 in the historic soap factory and expanded in 2011 to include the entire former residence and business premises of the Friedrich family, commemorates the great painter and greatest son of the city of Greifswald. The Caspar David Friedrich Centre is a museum, documentation, and research centre. Caspar David Friedrich was born here on 5 September 1774.

You can inspect his father's old soap factory, examine the family cabinet with the family tree, the Rügen Room, and the Eldena Room, which contain famous motifs from the artist's work, and tour the Caspar David Friedrich Gallery. The intermittent exhibitions of contemporary art at the Caspar David Friedrich Gallery bear witness to the enduring fascination and impact of his œuvre and the historical Romanticism he has come to personify.

# The Anniversary in the Pomeranian State Museum

He is the most important artist of German Romanticism and continues to inspire to this day: Caspar David Friedrich. Born in Greifswald in 1774, the free spirit and visionary will celebrate his 250th birthday in 2024. On the occasion of this noteworthy anniversary, the Pomeranian State Museum is dedicating a varied programme to him from March to December 2024. Three consecutive special exhibitions will bring together the museum's extensive collection with prestigious loans from national and international museums - and thus offer the opportunity to delve into paintings and drawings by the exceptional artist for almost the entire anniversary year. A particular highlight is the iconic masterpiece "Chalk Cliffs on Rügen", which for the first time ever will be on display in Mecklenburg-Western Pomerania. In addition to encountering the originals, visitors can expect a walk through the entire museum from March 2024 with interactive stages and so dip into Friedrich's life, work and epoch in an innovative way.

# Caspar David Friedrich. Lifelines A Walk in Drawings & Paintings Special exhibition 28.04. – 04.08.2024

With six paintings, more than 60 drawings and prints as well as numerous archival documents and letters, the Pomeranian State Museum owns one of the most considerable collections of original materials from Caspar David Friedrich's life and work worldwide. The special exhibition "Lifelines" presents the museum's extensive portfolio almost in its entirety for the first time and brings them into dialogue with precious items such as the entry in the baptism register from 1774 and additional loans as honored "birthday guests" in order to trace Friedrich's path from his first attempts at drawing to his late work.

# Caspar David Friedrich. Places of Longing Chalk Cliffs on Rügen & Greifswald Harbour Special exhibition 18.08. – 06.10.2024

The anniversary exhibition around Caspar David Friedrich's birthday on September 5th features a real star guest: the main work "Chalk Cliffs on Rügen". The world-famous painting, now at home in Winterthur, Switzerland, will be on display for seven weeks and for the first time ever presented in Friedrich's home region and at the Pomeranian State Museum – a long-awaited encounter of painting and landscape after more than 200 years! Combined with other masterpieces such as the "Greifswald Harbour" and "Eldena Ruin in the Giant Mountains", the exhibition casts a light upon the artist's "places of longing" in Swedish Pomerania and beyond. An additional hommage to Friedrich will extend the display. The photographer Volkmar Herre brings back the alluring view on the "Chalk Cliffs" through the camera obscura.

# Caspar David Friedrich. Hometown Meadows near Greifswald Special exhibition 16.10.2024 – 05.01.2025

Caspar David Friedrich remained closely connected to Greifswald, the place of his birth, childhood and youth, throughout his life. One of the most impressive testimonies to this is the painting "Meadows near Greifswald", which belongs to the Kunsthalle in Hamburg. In 2024 the Pomeranian State Museum will bring the painting back to the Baltic Sea and place it at the centre of the special exhibition, which will illuminate Friedrich's connection to his hometown and conclude the anniversary year. The presentation is complemented by preparatory drawings, views of the city by his contemporaries and a room installation which explores Friedrich's meadow landscape.



# 250 Steps towards Caspar David Friedrich Romantic Trail & Workshop Interactive stages

March - December 2024

Inspired by Friedrich's hikes, the Pomeranian State Museum invites visitors to set out on their own "art journey on foot" from March 2024 onwards. Past several interactive stations that encourage creative engagement with Caspar David Friedrich and his period, a specially created route leads from the forecourt through the museum to the original artworks. Along the way, an installation of the legendary "blue flower", a treadmill for own walks and a time box concerning the year 1818 can be found. In addition a cabinet exhibition with digital collages by the artist Hiroyuki Masuyama will create a link to the present and place Friedrich's wanderings in contemporary contexts, starting July 2024.

The exhibitions and accompanying formats in the Pomeranian State Museum are embedded in a wide-ranging cultural and scientific anniversary programme of the University and Hanseatic City of Greifswald and many participating institutions.

In addition to the exhibitions and festivities in Greifswald, Friedrich will be honoured in 2024 with special shows at the Hamburger Kunsthalle, the Alte Nationalgalerie Berlin and the Staatliche Kunstsammlungen Dresden, to some of which the Pomeranian State Museum will contribute loans. This will be followed in 2025 by a major retrospective at the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York.



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
